A service of prayer and meditation

A Tenebrae Service is a prolonged meditation of Christ's suffering upon the cross. There will be a prayer followed by a short scripture. Each scripture will be based on one of the seven statements of Jesus while he was dying on the cross. After each reading a candle will be extinguished, a verse from a hymn sung and the lights will be dimmed. We use this service to ponder the depth of Christ's suffering and death. The service will end in darkness with the exception of the eternal flame that is kept burning, knowing that Christ is forever and always present in our lives even on the darkest of nights.

Prayer for a national crisis – Lutheran Book of Prayer

Reading for Preparation

Responsive Reading

Psalm 22

- L: My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning?
- C: My God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer; by night, but I find no rest.

- L: But you, O LORD, be not far away; O my help, hasten to my aid.
- C: Deliver me from the sword, my life from the power of the dog.
- L: Save me from the lion's mouth! From the horns of wild bulls you have rescued me.
- C: I will declare your name to my people; in the midst of the assembly I will praise you.
- L: You who fear the LORD, give praise! All you of Jacob's line, give glory. Stand in awe of the LORD, all you offspring of Israel.
- C: For the LORD does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither is the LORD's face hidden from them; but when they cry out, the LORD hears them.
- L: From you comes my praise in the great assembly; I will perform my vows in the sight of

those who fear the LORD.

The Seven Last Words of Jesus on the Cross

The first word: Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do!

Prayer

- L: Almighty and eternal God,
- C: you give strength to the weary and courage to those who have lost heart. Heal the sick, comfort the dying, free those unjustly deprived of liberty, and deliver your world from hunger, crisis and disease. Hear the prayers of all who call on you in any trouble, receiving your help in their time of need. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reading Luke 23:26, 32-34

As they led him away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming from the country, and they laid the cross on him, and made him carry it behind Jesus. ³²Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. ³³When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. ³⁴Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." Prayer

Jesus, my Savior and the Shepherd of my soul, embrace me with Your love, and protect me throughout this day. I need You, for I am wounded and bruised, sick at heart, and in trouble and distress. To You I come. Forgive me all my sins in Your mercy and love, and uphold me amid these trials and tribulations. Strengthen my faith. Take every doubt out of my heart, and lead me into Your Word, where You promise to be with me always in every situation of life. Calm my nerves. Put my mind at ease. I know you will provide for me and place me in your love. Make me hopeful and patient. O Christ, have mercy upon me. O Christ, be with me now and forever. *Amen.*

Prayer

O dear God and Lord! I live, yet I know not how long. I must die and yet I do not know when. But as You alone know, then, O Lord, my heavenly Father, let it be so! Should this day (this night) be the last of my life, Lord, Your will be done, for it alone is the best way. Therefore, I am ready to live and die in true faith in Christ, my Redeemer. O merciful Father, do not forsake me and take not Your Holy Spirit from me. Give me enough time and space for repentance that I may acknowledge and confess the transgressions of my heart, that I may obtain forgiveness and comfort from Your saving Word, and that I may be preserved for eternal life. O Lord, who knows all hearts, my heart yearns for its future with You. *Amen.*

Prayer

Surely, O Lord, You made me Yours through water and Word and keep me with Jesus Christ in the one true faith, while we face crisis and affliction. It drains my will, tests my patience, and challenges my endurance. You have promised that You will not impose upon Your children more than we can endure, and I know the truth of this word. However, I remain weak and days of full health and renewed vigor seem far away. I know not if I am closer to the beginning or the end of this trial. In weakness and uncertainty, sins of doubt and despair tempt me. Forgive these and all my other iniquities of thought, word, and deed. Remind me of Your grace, keeping my eyes fixed on Jesus, the Author and Finisher of my faith. Lead me through this wilderness of testing for the sake of Your Son, Jesus, who knows my pain and weakness through His own temptation and passion. *Amen.*

Readings John 19:28-29
